## Guide to Pubs in the local area.

The Pubs listed here are all within a couple of miles of the site. Wellesbourne is a mile and a half away and Charlecote is about a mile as is Loxley. There are also a lot of good pubs further afield but these are within reasonable walking distance of the site. Just be careful walking on the local roads as there are no footpaths and some lanes are quite narrow.

There are many other excellent gastro pubs and restaurants in the surrounding towns and villages and Warwick, Leamington, Kenilworth and of course Stratford are all within easy reach and boast many and various good eateries. ## The Kings Head

### **A little pub history**

The King's Head has always played an important part in the history of Wellesbourne. Originally known as The Wellsbourne Inn in the 1600s, the King's Head was used as a hospital during the English Civil War. During the Second World War, it played host to the RAF pilots and ground crews from near by Wellsbourne Mountford airfield.

Dating back to the year 1640, The Stag's Head is a Grade II listed building adorned atop by its traditional thatched roof and retaining many original features including its visible classic timber frame and flagstone floors.

The pub was founded in 1830 and was the original meeting place for Joseph Arch (founder of the Trade Union Movement).

The pub walls are adorned with framed pictures of both past and present, with a history lesson of the pub, the village and the people of Wellesbourne.
